1. Course outline

General characteristics of real estate objects and the real estate market. Real estate activity. Real estate specialists. The procedure for conducting a transaction with immovable property.

- to possess a skill of: independent search and logical interpretation of regulatory literature in the field of real estate and transactions with it; real estate market analysis; drawing up contracts for real estate transactions; search in open sources of information regarding the activities of a realtor and its analysis.
