1. Course outline

The purpose of the discipline "International Economics" is study of the patterns of the modern world economy to increase the competitiveness of Belarusian enterprises specializing in the economy of electronic business.

know: : stages of the formation of the world economy; features of the modern world economy; functions of the international market; the concept, goals and motives of foreign investment; the principles of absolute and comparative advantage in international trade; causes and effects of international labor migration; the concept, levels and effects of international economic integration; features of modern international finance; the concept of nominal and real exchange rates; the concept and modern version of the country's balance of payments; objectives and instruments of macroeconomic policy in an open economy;

be able to: estimate GDP per capita taking into account purchasing power parity (PPP); to determine the place of the country in the structure of the world economy; determine the type of trade policy; assess the existence of absolute and relative advantages in international trade; distinguish between direct and portfolio investments; assess factors affecting the exchange rate;

have the skill: determining the level of competitiveness in the international economy; calculation of fixed and floating exchange rates; assessing the effects of international integration on consumers and producers; estimates of the analytical version of the balance of payments.
